Just like our work to make it easier to build solar on previously developed land such as rooftops, parking lots, and landfills, this pollinator solar program is about taking something good - solar - and making it even better * Also in 2018, VPIRG and our members urged the legislature to require a significant portion of the \$18.7 million VW settlement be allocated toward electric vehicles instead of fossil fuel vehicles. Along with our allies, we pushed for at least \$4.5 million to go toward a statewide electric vehicle incentive program. While the final allocation fell short of this goal, we're proud to have played a role in ensuring that at least a portion of the funds went toward electric vehicle expansion * Finally, VPIRG continued to grow the broad-based Energy Independent Vermont Coalition working to tackle climate change by putting a price on carbon

renewable power VPIRG works to advance policies and programs that aim to stop our continued reliance on fossil fuels and other dirty energy like nuclear power, and to

Under the new legislation the State will now reclaim the deposits and use the money (millions of dollars each year) to help clean up Vermont's waterways. This is a victory many years in the making - the result of hard

work and grassroots advocacy by countless VPIRG staffers, members, supporters and allies * In addition, we continued to research and advocate for stronger recycling

programs and implementation of extended producer responsibility for the waste that manufacturers' products generate in the system
